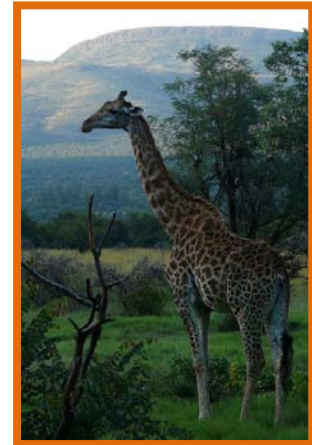
## PROJECT INFORMATION

The Wildlife Care Centre Project was established in 1991 and is a haven for sick, injured and problem animals. From lions to hyenas to honeybadgers, vultures, cheetah, and many more are cared for at this project. It was a heartfelt initiative that could no longer sustain itself, so the idea to raise money from visitors arose. This was done by asking an entry fee to generate income in order to meet the demands of costs to feed the animals, to acquire medical supplies and the constant improvement and building of new cages.



At the Wildlife Care Centre Projects, volunteers will gain lots of hands-on experience and direct involvement in caring for the animals. This project is not for the faint hearted!

We cannot dictate the day or what animals we will have in the Centre at the time of your visit, but do, do our best to keep you busy and make your stay an interesting one with other activities as well to do with the bush.



## VOLUNTEER INVOLVEMENT

Our day begins at 07H00 and all volunteers meet at the animal clinic for a briefing and the daily allocation of tasks.

The priority of the day will be the feeding and cleaning of all the animals and their enclosures in the morning and in the afternoon. During the rest of the day there are general tasks that need to be done.

Working with raw meat and dead chickens is part of the day.

There is no typical day at the Wildlife Care Centre...anything can happen!

Everything that happens just adds to your experience here in

Africa. Working with animals can scramble up all plans made, can delay meals and rob you of your sleep.
